
#### **ONLINE: Teen Writing Workshop: Story Senses**

gust 30.

The Library's Summer StoryWalk™ will feature three engaging picture books. Begin your StoryWalk™ experience at our front patio and follow the signs outdoors along the Library's sidewalk. Enhance your reading experience with prompts found on each sign.

The Community Library of DeWitt & Jamesville's Summer StoryWalk™ Schedule:

June 29- July 19: Scoot by Cathryn Falwell. Six silent turtles sit still on a log in a pond while other animals and insects move around

July 20- August 9: And Here's To You by David Elliott. Celebrate the diversity of creatures on our planet from bubbly fish to adorable dogs.

August 10- August 30: Explorers of the Wild by Cale Atkinson. Two courageous explorers,

a boy and a bear, unexpectedly encounter one another.

The StoryWalk™ Project was created by Anne Ferguson of Montpelier, VT and developed in collaboration with the Vermont Bicycle & Pedestrian Coalition (VBPC) and Kellogg Hubbard Library. StoryWalk™ is a fun learning activity that allows children and their families to explore nature and read along with a picture book.

The Community Library of DeWitt & Jamesville's Summer StoryWalk™ was made possible by a state grant secured by former Senator John A. DeFrancisco in 2016 and was previously displayed at Ryder Park in coordination with the Town of DeWitt.

When your items are available, you will be notified by phone or e-mail. Call the Library at **315-446-3578** to schedule a pick-up appointment.

Appointments are for a 15 minute slot. Up to 5 items may be picked up per appointment. Holds placed on family members' cards may be picked up during your appoint-

To ensure that as many patrons as possible can take advantage of this service, we ask that you limit appointments to no more than one appointment per two week period.

During your appointment time, your holds will be available for pick up on our Patio Pick-Up tables in front of the Library.

Your items will be labelled with the first three initials of your last name and your appointment date and time.

Just pick up your bundle and go. Your items will already be checked out to you prior to your arrival.

#### **RETURN YOUR LIBRARY ITEMS**

Please return all library materials to our outside book drop.

Per CDC guidelines, items will be quarantined 7 days before they are checked in. No fines will be charged for this period.
